Professor Pamela Naidoo has a Master's Degree in Clinical Psychology (MA, Clin Psych) and a Master's degree in Public Health (MPH). She also holds a Doctorate in Philosophy in Behavioural Medicine (DPhil) from the University of Natal (now UKZN). As a public health specialist, she has more than 35 years of experience in the health sector. At present Prof Naidoo is the CEO of the Heart and Stroke Foundation South Africa and also holds an Extraordinary Professorship in the Faculty of Community and Health Sciences at the University of the Western Cape, is Professor Extraordinary in the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences (Psychiatry) at Stellenbosch University and an Extraordinary Professor in the Department of Medicine at the University of Cape Town. At present Prof Naidoo is also the Past President of the African Heart Network, a member of the Expert Advisory Committee of the World Heart Federation, a Research Committee member of the World Stroke Organization, and an Executive Committee member of the African Stroke Organization.



Keynote Speaker:

Professor Mpiko Ntsekhe

Helen and Morris Mauerberger Professor and Chair of Cardiology at the University of Cape Town

Mpiko Ntsekhe is the Hellen and Morris Mauerberger Professor and Chair of Cardiology, at the University of Cape Town where he has been based after graduating from Brown University (BA), Columbia's College of Physicians and Surgeons (MD) and the University of Cape Town (MPhil & PhD) and completing his clinical training in Internal Medicine (FCP SA) and Cardiology (Cert Cardio SA). The department he heads is a continental and global leader in the provision of tertiary and quaternary cardiac services, cardiovascular medicine related research, and has an excellent track record of teaching and training the next generation of Africa's leading cardiovascular health scientists and clinicians. Ntsekhe's areas of research focus are: epidemiology cardiovascular disease in sub-Saharan Africa; the investigation of the intersection of infectious and cardiovascular disease and its impact on burden and outcomes in SSA; and translational research aimed at improving treatment options and outcomes for patients and communities with a high burden of both neglected and emerging cardiovascular diseases in sub-Saharan Africa. His contributions to cardiovascular medicine to date have been acknowledged through multiple prestigious international and local fellowships, awards and honours.
